

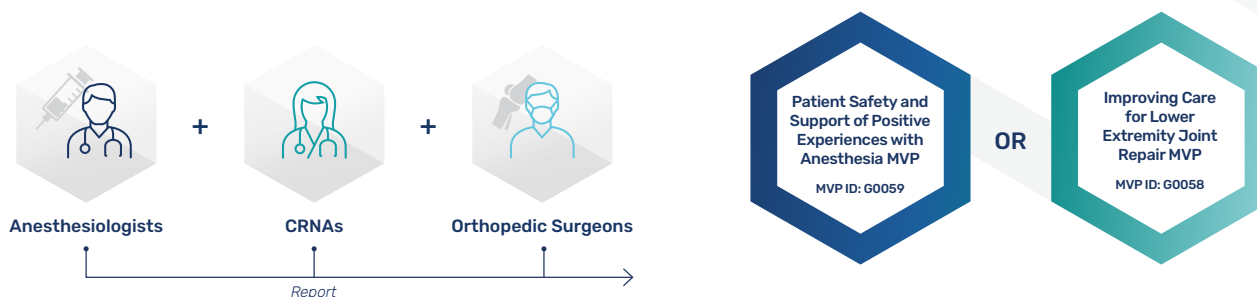
Subgroup Participation Examples

MVPs are a new, voluntary [MIPS reporting option](#) available to clinicians beginning with the 2023 performance year. The [MVP reporting option](#) also introduces a [new participation option called subgroups](#).

Subgroups are subsets of clinicians from the same group (identified by a single Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)) with at least 2 clinicians including at least one individually eligible MIPS eligible clinician. You may only participate in one subgroup per TIN/ NPI (National Provider Identifier) combination.

MVPs are currently optional; MIPS eligible clinicians should [Explore MVPs](#) to review the available MVPs and see if one is right for them or their practice. Here are 4 examples of how a group that consists of anesthesiologists, certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNAs), and orthopedic surgeons could choose to report an MVP.

EXAMPLE 1: Register as a Group and Report 1 MVP (Not as a Subgroup)



***Reminder:** Beginning with the 2026 performance year, multispecialty groups can't report an MVP at the group level.

EXAMPLE 2: Register as 2 Subgroups and Report 2 MVPs

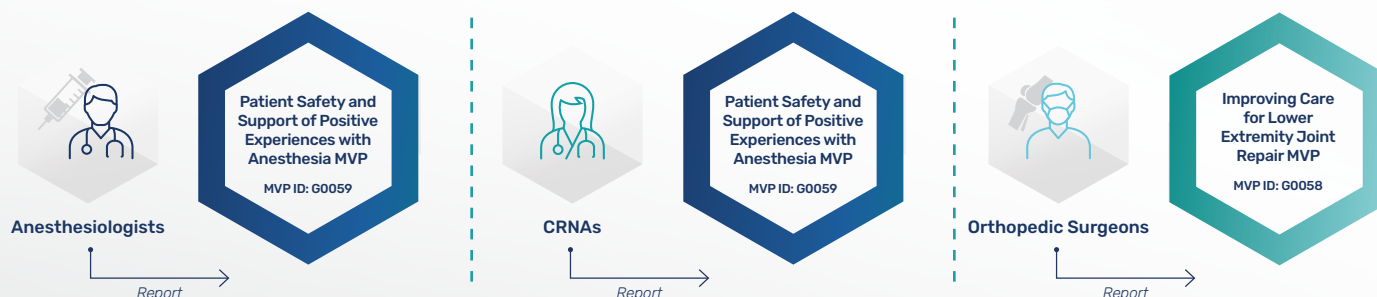
Note: The clinicians in this example are all part of the same TIN, but each clinician is only included in one subgroup.



MIPS eligible clinicians in a multispecialty group reporting MVPs will only be able to do so at the individual, subgroup, or APM Entity level for the 2026 performance year and beyond.

EXAMPLE 3: Register as 3 Subgroups and Report 2 MVPs

Note: The clinicians in this example are all part of the same TIN, but each clinician is only included in one subgroup. In this example, the 2 subgroups reporting the anesthesia MVP have selected different quality measures within the MVP.



MIPS eligible clinicians in a multispecialty group reporting MVPs will only be able to do so at the individual, subgroup, or APM Entity level beginning in the 2026 performance year. Multispecialty groups will still be able to report traditional MIPS as a group in the 2026 performance year.

Subgroup Participation Examples (continued)

MIPS eligible clinicians in a multispecialty group reporting MVPs will only be able to do so at the individual, subgroup, or APM Entity level starting with the **2026 performance year**. Before then, multispecialty groups may want to consider testing the subgroup participation option. As shown below, a multispecialty group could continue to report traditional MIPS, but also register a subset of clinicians in the group to report an MVP as a subgroup.

EXAMPLE 4: Report Traditional MIPS as a Group + Register to Report an MVP as a Subgroup
